"What does it look like for me to faithfully follow Christ?" This is one of the most important questions one could ask themselves, not just for themselves personally but also for their family, workplace, and church. I encourage you to write this question on a sheet of paper and place it on your desk, fridge, or anywhere else you frequent often. We were made by God to love Him and our neighbors. This looks different for you than it does for me. However, we were made for this purpose. The world teaches us that our purpose in this life is to obtain "success" at all costs. The pursuit of being successful often leads us away from asking the question above because the pursuit of success is often built on our selfinterests and building oneself up. The question above, however, is not about us but rather about faithfully using our gifts for Christ's sake and not our own. There is someone more worthy of our efforts than ourselves. The world around us often measures success using stats and numbers, which are based on results. However, success should look differently for Christians than for the rest of the world.
